Explanation of early and late quota methods

Traditional polling for voting intention works in two stages, given a set of respondents with valid demographic data. Firstly, quota weights are assigned to each respondent based on known demographic quotas (for age, sex, past vote, etc), to make the sample approximately representative. Secondly, respondents are removed who did not express a clear voting intention (i.e. don't know, would not say) The headline voting intention is then based on the filtered respondents and their weights.

We call this method "early quota", because the quota weights are calculated early in the process, before non-definite respondents are removed.

But we could run this process in the other order:
Firstly, remove respondents who did not express a clear voting intention.
And then calculate the quota weights on this remaining sub-sample.

We call this method "late quota" because the quota weights are calculated late in the process.

The difference between these two methods could be important if there are a large number of don't knows or refuseds.
At the moment we have 14% of all voters, and 12% of Conservative voters, who don't have a clear VI.

The "early quota" method effectively assumes that DKs/refuseds will not vote.
The "late quota" method effectively assumes that these voters will vote in the same way as people with similar characteristics who did express an opinion

We are now using the Late Quota method as our default method, though the Early Quota tables are show for information. It produces less extreme leads for the Labour party, showing a 26% lead rather than a 29% lead. It is also more consistent with the MRP method, which has similar assumptions about non-respondents.

Find Out Now interviewed 1,380 GB adults who had a clear voting intention online from 10-14 March 2023. Data were weighted to be demographically representative of all GB adults by gender, age, social grade, other demographics and past voting patterns. Weighting targets come from the 2011 census and the reported election results. Weighted population total is the effective sample size of the equivalent uniform sample with the same sample errors.

All polls are subject to a wide range of potential sources of error. On the basis of the historical record of the polls at recent general elections, there is a 9 in 10 chance that the true value of a party's support lies within 4 points of the estimates provided by this poll, and a 2 in 3 chance that they lie within 2 points.
